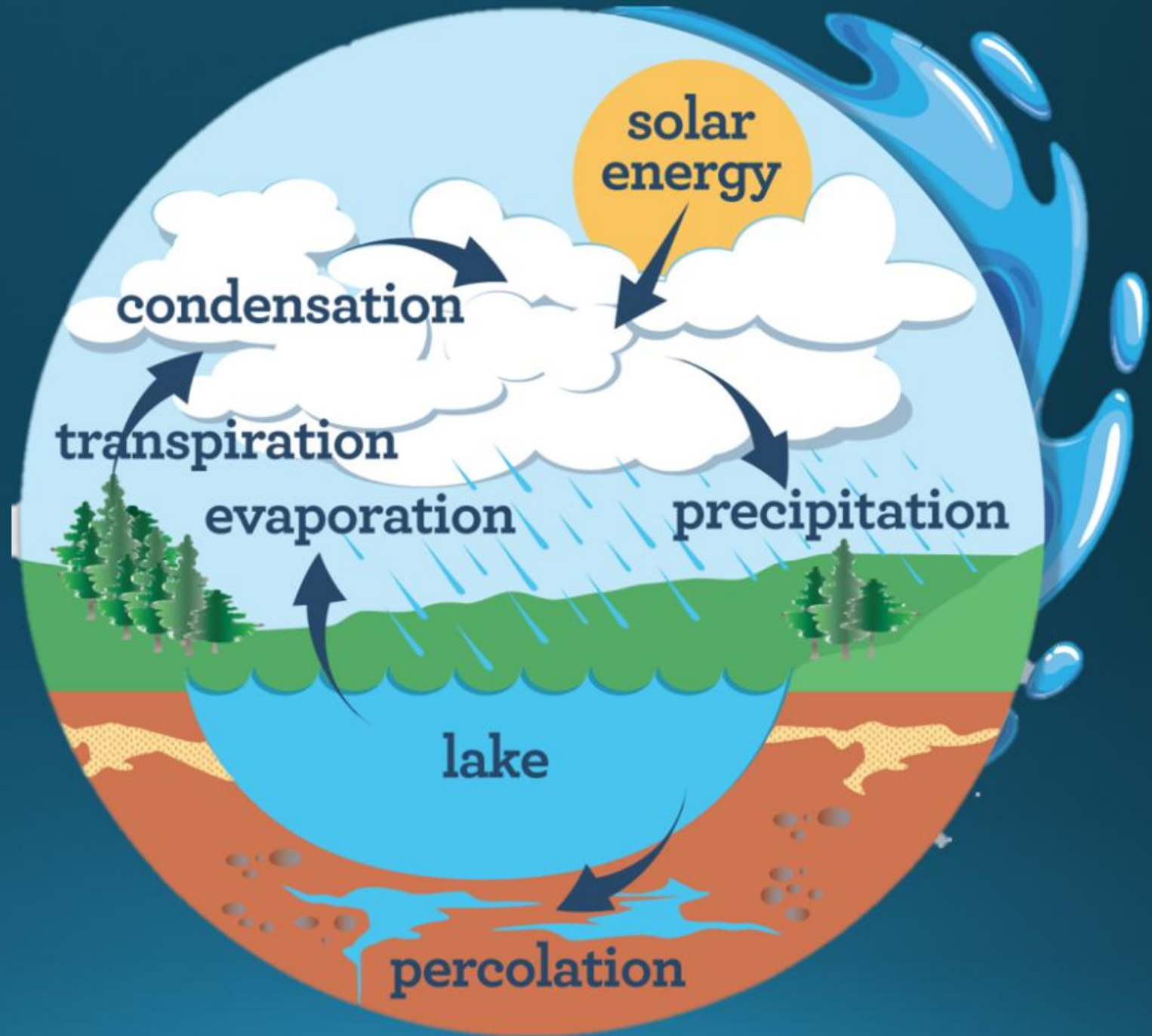


World Water Day 2025

Glaciers – Earth's Frozen 'Water Towers'



- Glaciers are giant frozen reservoirs of fresh water and store about 70 % of Earth's fresh water.
- During warmer seasons, glaciers slowly melt, releasing water downstream.
- Glaciers are crucial for regulating Earth's climate.
- Climate change is causing glaciers to melt faster and changing the water cycle in ways that can affect people and the environment.

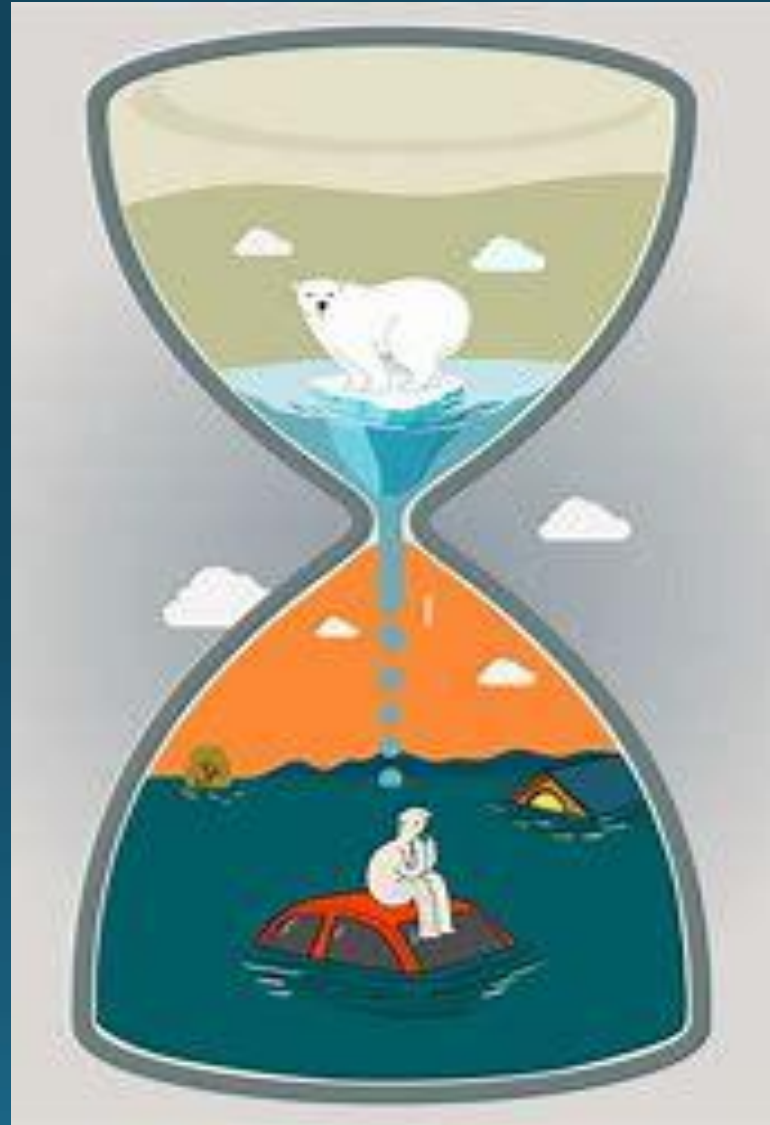
Climate Record- Keepers!

- Each layer of snow and ice that builds up over time traps small bubbles of air, pollen, dust, and other particles, preserving information about past climates.

By studying these layers, scientists can learn about Earth's climate going back thousands of years.
